"Managing twins' tantrums, studies and activities while maintaining my health was overwhelming. But with my husband's help and a flexible setup at work, I restarted my PR career. With the right support and openness to ask for help, you can reignite your passions and chase your dreams."

Even within the home, shared responsibility is key to long-term sustainability. As **Debasmita** Mukherjee, a mommy blogger and work-from-home mom, puts it:

"It is not only a mother's duty to raise a child and look after the home, it is also the duty of the father. If my husband wins the 'bread', then I make the 'sandwiches'; so all I can say, it is all about equal contribution."

Workplace policies that are parent-friendly don't just benefit mothers — they enhance productivity, loyalty, and leadership across the board.

"Balancing a career and family is a challenge that many mothers face," notes **Ms. Ritika Gupta**, Career Counsellor at AAera Consultants. "Companies that prioritize flexibility foster a more inclusive, resilient, and motivated workforce, ultimately benefiting both employees and employers."

"Today's mothers are redefining success—not by choosing between career and caregiving, but by integrating both with purpose and resilience," adds Dr. Vandana Singh, Chairperson – Aviation Cargo, Federation of Aviation Industry India. "When organizations support women through these critical life stages... they cultivate stronger, more dynamic leadership."

Another vital voice in this conversation is **Monisha Sharma**, Mother & Co-Founder of CITTA and Director & Co-Founder of The Lexicon Group, who emphasizes the importance of adaptability:
